

STUART ALDEROTY

Stuart Alderoty is the Chief Litigation Counsel for American Express Company where he manages all domestic litigation for American Express and all its affiliates and subsidiaries. Prior to joining American Express in February 2002, Stuart was a litigator in private practice for 17 years, the last 13 of which with LeBoeuf, Lamb, Greene & MacRae, where he was partner since 1995. From 1989 to 1991, and while at LeBoeuf, Stuart served as Special Counsel to the Court-appointed independent Administrator of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters as part of the Government's efforts to rid that union of organized crime influences.

In 1993, Stuart was appointed by Attorney General William P. Barr as a Special Assistant United States Attorney in connection with an Independent Counsel investigation of loans by Banca Nazionale del Lavoro to Iraq ("Iraqgate"). Stuart has lectured on privilege issues and taught legal writing and appellate advocacy at Seton Hall Law School as an adjunct from 1992-1997.
